Troop 35 has a long tradition of serving our Jacksonville community. At the end of the year, as we collect data to send to council about the many hours that have been donated in the service of others, I thought I would share some of these diverse projects in which many of our scouts have participated. Let your Service Project coordinator (Trenton Orr) know if you have any suggestions. Thanks to Cory Vaughn and Nicholi Brown for shepherding most of the projects below.

Serving the Southside United Methodist Church Pancake Breakfast in Feb and BBQ in October. UCOM Food Pantry often requests help from Troop 35 several times throughout the year for packing food, helping with their Client Christmas party (this coming weekend), and manning a table to collect food donations at community events like fun runs.

New River Plantation donated citrus for our Pancake breakfast and several scouts donated time to pick hanging moss off the trees in August. Scouts served at a water station on the Wine and Chocolate 5K Run which started in San Marco and ran through our neighborhood. Flags were set out around the church point for July 4th weekend. Scouts also served as color guard for a number of events in the

community including the MS150 Bike ride in October.

Our troop provided a significant number of service hours at the Special Needs campout in October where a carnival booth was manned and the scouts provided assistance to clients fishing (and several fish were caught!) They also helped with the tent city for the special clients. Eagle Projects included transforming an underused outdoor courtyard at a local church to be a picnic area for the preschool (Ryan Garner); transforming the inside of an SUMC owned small house with paint and elbow grease for use by the SUMC (Jesse Evans); connecting 2 of the SUMC houses with a concrete walkway (Matthew Knowling). These projects represent considerable effort on the part of the Eagle candidate to locate materials and organize manpower and equipment to complete them.
